Common names: Fiddle-leaf, Banjo fig, Lyre-leaf fig tree



Care instructions:

1. Light: Bright, Indirect Exposure

Place your Fiddle Leaf Fig in a location with **bright, indirect light** for about 6–8 hours daily. Avoid direct sunlight, as it can scorch the leaves.

2. Watering: When the Top 2–3 Inches Are Dry

Water your plant when the top 2–3 inches of soil feel dry to the touch. Ensure thorough watering until excess water drains from the bottom.

3. Soil: Well-Draining Mix

Use a well-draining potting mix to prevent waterlogging.

4. Temperature: Maintain Warmth

Keep your plant in a warm environment with temperatures between 60–80°F (15–27°C).

5. Fertilizer: Monthly During Growing Season

Fertilize your Fiddle Leaf Fig monthly during the spring and summer with a balanced, watersoluble fertilizer.
