# Aloe Vera Report - Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0

#### Name of the Plant:

**Aloe Vera** (Botanical Name: Aloe barbadensis miller)

#### Care Instructions:

- Needs bright, indirect sunlight. Can tolerate some direct sun, but is not recommended
- Water well but infrequently. Let the soil dry out completely between waterings (usually once every 2 weeks).
- Well-draining, sandy or cactus potting mix of soil is preferable.
- Ensure the pot has drainage holes to avoid root rot.
- Prefers warm temperatures and low humidity.

#### Ecological Benefits:

- Absorbs toxins like formaldehyde and benzene from indoor air.
- Prevents erosion due to its thick, fibrous roots.
- Needs very little water, making it ideal for arid climates.
- Naturally regenerates and can be harvested repeatedly without harming the plant.

#### Interesting Facts:

- The gel is widely used for burns, cuts, skin moisturization, and even digestion.
- Common in lotions, shampoos, and face creams.
- Known as the "plant of immortality" by ancient Egyptians.
- Aloe Vera rarely suffers from pest attacks due to its thick leaves and antibacterial properties.

# **№** Aloe Vera Care in Oman:

### O 1. Light

- Aloe vera needs **bright sunlight**, but **too much direct desert sun** (especially in peak afternoon) can scorch the leaves.
- Ideal spot: Place it where it gets morning sun and afternoon shade—like a south- or east-facing balcony or a bright window indoors.

#### **□ 2. Pot & Soil**

- Use a pot with drainage holes.
- Soil must be **well-draining**: cactus/succulent mix or a mix of **sand** + **potting soil** works great.
- Avoid regular garden soil—it holds too much water.

### **▲** 3. Watering

- Water deeply but rarely—about once every 2–3 weeks in summer, and even less in winter.
- Make sure soil **dries out completely** between watering.
- Avoid water collecting in the pot—overwatering is the #1 killer of aloe plants.

# **%** 4. Temperature

- Aloe vera thrives in 20°C to 35°C.
- It can tolerate heat, but bring it **indoors or shaded** during **extreme temperatures over** 40°C.
- Protect from cold drafts if temps drop below 10°C in winter.

#### 5. Air & Ventilation

- Ensure good airflow, especially indoors—avoid stuffy, closed spaces.
- If indoors, place near a window with natural light.

#### **♦ 6. Pests & Problems**

- Watch for **soft, mushy leaves** (overwatering) or **brown, crispy tips** (too much sun or not enough water).
- Rarely, you might see mealybugs—wipe them off with a cloth dipped in mild soap water.

## **7** 7. Repotting & Growth

- Repot every 2–3 years or if the roots outgrow the pot.
- You can **propagate** new aloe plants from the "pups" (small plants growing at the base).
