Devil's Backbone (Euphorbia tithymaloides)

Also known as Zigzag Plant, Redbird Cactus, or Slipper Plant — is a tropical succulent with a dramatic, zigzagging stem structure that gives it its spine-like nickname.

? Care Instructions

- **Light**: Prefers bright, indirect sunlight. Can tolerate some direct sun in cooler months but needs protection from harsh rays in summer.
